

**2018 Heads Up Football
Scholastic Training Commitment**

I,{{{IndividualName}}}, of {{{orgName}}}, commit to having my football coaches certified using the Heads Up Football® Coach Certification offered by Heads Up Football, LLC for the 2018 football season. Certification includes modules on shoulder tackling, blocking, and equipment fitting, heat and hydration, sudden cardiac arrest, and concussion education.

Coaches must complete these modules online through NFHSLearn.com. The shoulder tackling, blocking, and equipment fitting module is available for a fee of \$10 per coach. The heat and hydration, sudden cardiac arrest, and concussion education modules are free. All payments are made directly to the NFHS.

The fees associated with completing these modules may be paid by your school, the individual coaches, or a third party, including by a grant from HUF, ESPN, the NFL, or an NFL Club.

Upon completion of the Heads Up Football Coach Certification, the certified coach will be eligible to receive \$1 million excess coach liability insurance in excess of any other valid insurance, whether collectable or not, for the calendar year in which the certification was completed.

Upon making your commitment, we will provide you administrator access to HUF LLC's then available suite of online football resources. In order to access these resources and track coach certifications you will need to enroll on USAFootball.com.

If you want to renew your commitment for the following year, you will need to complete a new commitment form. You will be unable to recommit (regardless of who is designated to pay the associated fees) if your school owes a balance from the previous season(s).

Schools or school districts interested in additional in-person training for their coaches may schedule a private Heads Up Football training conducted by HUF LLC for up to 50 coaches for a set fee of \$1,250. Additional coaches may attend the training for a fee of \$20 per additional coach.

The fees associated with additional in-person trainings may be paid by your school, the individual coaches, or a third party, including by a grant from HUF, ESPN, the NFL, or an NFL Club.
